Use/Importance: Important in extraction of Mn from ores. Forms a number of complexes with NH₃, N₂H₄, urea; and double sulfates with Na, K, NH₄, Al^{III}, Fe^{III}, Cr^{III}. Dietary mineral supplement

Physical Description: Pale pink cryst. thermally v. stable. Dec. above 700° to form SO₂, SO₃ and Mn oxides

Melting Point: Mp 710 ° (at 4850 atm.)

Solubility: Sol. H₂O; sl. sol. MeOH, EtOH

Other Data: Other phases exist at high temps. and press. $\mu_{\text{eff}} = 5.7\mu_{\text{B}}$ (77-600K)
